**An Act to amend the Liquor Licensing Act.**

[30th April, 1993

ENACTED by the Parliament of Zambia.

Enactment

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Act, 1993, and shall be read as one with the Liquor Licensing Act, in this Act referred to as the principal Act.

Short title and commencement

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on 30th January, 1993.

2. The principle Act is amended by the repeal of the Schedule and the substitution thereof of the Schedule set out in the Appendix to this Act.

## PRESCRIBED FEES

1. Fees for the grant or renewal of a—	K
Wholesale liquor licence	60,000
Retail liquor licence	42,000
Bar licence	42,000
Airport licence	30,000
Hotel liquor licence	50,000
Private hotel liquor licence	42,000
Restaurant licence	30,000
Railway restaurant car licence	7,500
Passenger vessel licence	15,000
Theatre licence	22,000
Club licence	20,000
Temporary licence: per twenty-four hours or part thereof	26,000
Restricted licence: one half of the fees prescribed above for the appropriate full licence	

Where any licence is granted on or after 1st July, one-half of the appropriate fee prescribed above shall be payable in respect of the period to the 31st December next following.

2. For the extension of the permitted hours under the provisions of section *twenty-seven* of the Act, there shall be paid a fee of one thousand kwacha in respect of every hour or part thereof by which the permitted hours are extended.

Transfer of a restricted passenger vessel licence for vessels on lake Kariba and other lakes	1,500
Removal licence	5,000

4. The fee payable upon an appeal to the tribunal shall be	20,000
