An Act to amend the Liquor Licensing Act

[3rd June, 1994

ENACTED by the Parliament of Zambia.

Enactment

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Liquor Licensing (Amendment) Act, 1994, and shall be read as one with the Liquor Licensing Act, in this Act referred to as the principal Act.

Short title and commencement

(2) This Act shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 29th January, 1994.

2. The principal Act is amended by the repeal of the Schedule and the substitution therefor of the Schedule set out in the Appendix to this Act.

Where any licence is granted on or after 1st July, one-half of the appropriate fee prescribed above shall be payable in respect of the period to the 31st December, next following.

2. For extension of the permitted hours under the provisions of section *twenty-seven* of the Act, there shall be paid a fee of one thousand kwacha in respect of every hour or part thereof by which the permitted hours are extended.
