The Customs and Excise Act

The Customs and Excise (Suspension) (Amendment)  
Regulations, 1983

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section *eighty-nine* of the Customs and Excise Act, the following Regulations are hereby made:

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Customs and Excise (Suspension) (Amendment) Regulations, 1983, and shall be read as one with the Customs and Excise (Suspension) Regulations, hereinafter referred to as the principal Regulations.

(2) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 29th January, 1983.

2. The principal Regulations are amended by the re-

3. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the First Schedule to the Act, there are hereby suspended the duties chargeable on any item of sports footwear, pads, shin-guards, or the like when such item is designed for a particular sport.
