## **PETITION**

The Petition of JOHN SICHINGA of Ndola in the Copperbelt Province of the Republic of Zambia SHOWETH that:

- 1. Your Petitioner JOHN SICHINGA is a person who was a candidate at the aforesaid election.
- Your Petitioner JOHN SICHINGA states that the election was held on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of August 2021 when ROBERT CHABINGA for the Patriotic Front (PF) was declared as being duly elected.
- 3. Your Petitioner polled 9,235 votes against the 1st Respondent's 15,921 votes.
- 4. And the Petitioner says that ROBERT CHABINGA was not duly elected because the elections in the said Constituency were held in an atmosphere which was not free and fair due to widespread malpractices, vote buying, bribery and corruption.

- 5. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Respondent being responsible for receiving and accepting or rejecting nominations for election as Member of Parliament did not undertake the requisite due diligence on the 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent's Grade 12 certificate presented with his nomination application as information has emerged that he may have used a forged certificate and therefore was not duly nominated as per requirement of the Constitution of Zambia.
- 6. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Respondent being responsible for conducting the said election did not allow my party representatives to witness the arrival and verification of ballot papers when the same was delivered to Mafinga District Council offices.
- 7. The 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent's national campaign team led by Mr. Joe Malanji gave cash handouts ranging between K40 and K300 to attendees of their rallies held at Thendele and Muyombe respectively on 8<sup>th</sup> August 2021.
- 8. On 11<sup>th</sup> August 2021 the 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent acting through his agents distributed cash transfer funds to villagers throughout the constituency as an inducement to vote for him and his party and further threatened recipients that they would be removed from the list of beneficiaries if they do not for his party the following day. The 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent further promised newly listed beneficiaries of social cash payment on Friday 13<sup>th</sup> August 2021 after they vote for him and his party.
- 9. Throughout the night of 11<sup>th</sup> August 2021 the 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent and his campaign team distributed various amounts of money, mealie meal and buckets of cooking oil to would be voters throughout the constituency.
- 10. The 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent through an organisation affiliated to his political party called GGOZA distributed foodstuff, money and provided transport to voters to various polling station throughout polling day.
- 11. The 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent provided branded party motor vehicles to ferry voters from their respective homes to polling stations and on the way persuaded them to vote for himself and his party.
- 12. On polling day, 12<sup>th</sup> August 2021, the 1<sup>st</sup> Respondent through his agents prepared food at various vantage points near polling stations which food was being given to voters in addition to giving them cash handouts as an inducement to vote for him and his party.

- 13. The Petitioner's accredited monitors were denied entry to some polling stations on polling day by officers of the 2<sup>nd</sup> Respondent.
- 14. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Respondent's presiding officers denied the Petitioner's polling agents results form Gen.20a in 11 polling stations and in one polling station the polling agent was asked to sign an unfilled form.

WHEREOF the Petitioner prays that it may be determined that;

- 1) The said ROBERT CHABINGA was not duly elected or returned and the election was void.
- 2) The said ROBERT CHABINGA was not duly nominated as he did not have the requisite Grade 12 certificate.
