## The Chadiza District Council (Cattle Levy) By-laws, 1990

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in sections *fifty-two* and *fifty-nine* of the Local Administration Act, 1980, the following By-laws are hereby made:

1. These By-laws may be cited as the Chadiza District Council (Cattle Levy) By-laws, 1990. Title
  
2. In these By-laws, unless the context otherwise requires--- Interpre-  
tation
  - "area" means the area under the jurisdiction of the Council;
  - "cattle" means bulls, cows, heifers, calves, oxen, pigs, sheep and goats and any part thereof whether dead or alive;
  - "check-point" means any place within the area designated by the Council for the payment of cattle levy;
  - "collector" means any officer of the Council authorised to collect revenue for the Council;
  - "Council" means the Chadiza District Council;
  - "movement permit" means a permit issued by a Veterinary Officer under the provisions of the Stock Diseases Regulations. Cap. 387,

3. Every person who slaughters cattle within the area to sell the meat thereof, or exports cattle from the area, shall pay to the Council a cattle levy, at the following rates: Imposition  
of cattle  
levy
  - (a) in the case of a bull, cow, heifer, calf, ox or pig, a levy of five kwacha;
  - (b) in the case of a goat or sheep, a levy of one kwacha per beast.
  
4. No person shall slaughter cattle in the area to sell the meat thereof or export from the area any cattle for which no cattle levy has been paid. No slaughter

5. (1) Cattle levy shall become payable as soon as the cattle has been weighed at the check-point.

(2) Payment of cattle levy in respect of any weight of cattle shall be made at the check-point and shall be received by a collector who shall immediately issue an official receipt for each such payment.

Offences and  
penalties

6. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of these By-laws shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable upon conviction—

(a) in the case of a first offence, to a fine not exceeding one hundred kwacha or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding three months, or to both;

(b) in the case of a second or subsequent offence, to a fine not exceeding two hundred kwacha or to imprisonment for a period not exceeding six months, or to both.
