The Information and Communication Technologies (Allocation of 3G Frequencies) Regulations, 2010

IN EXERCISE of the powers contained in section *ninety-one* of the Information and Communication Technologies Act, 2009, the following Regulations are hereby made:

Title

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Information and Communication Technologies (Allocation of 3G Frequencies) Regulations, 2010.

Interpretation

- 2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires— "mobile cellular services" means voice and data services to consumers over mobile cellular networks: and
 - "mobile cellular service provider" means the holder of a licence to provide a mobile cellular service, including any successor in title thereto.


Frequency allocation

- 3. (1) The frequency allocation in respect of mobile cellular services shall be as set out in the Schedule.
- (2) The Authority may allocate to a mobile cellular service provider such part of the allocated frequency as it may determine.


No exclusive right to frequency

- 4. (1) The Authority reserves the right to modify, suspend or withdraw frequency or frequencies in accordance with the Act.
- (2) For the avoidance of doubt, the allocation of frequency to a mobile cellular service provider shall not—
 - (a) confer on such service provider the monopoly of the use of the frequency; or
 - (b) be construed as conferring on the service provider an exclusive right in respect of such frequency.
